Online CPD

Please note that our newest online clinical case study, [The Diagnosis and Management of First-Line Antiretroviral Treatment Failure](#), is also focused on [treatment resistance and will allow you to test your knowledge](#). Guidelines

Two important new changes to the national antiretroviral programme will be implemented in April: the launch of fixed-dose drug combinations (FDCs) and "option B", where all pregnant women will be given triple therapy through pregnancy and the breastfeeding period, regardless of CD4 count. Society members are working with the National Department of Health (NDOH) and the South African National AIDS Council (SANAC) to develop clinical guidance for health care workers to support the launch of these new policies, and we will keep you informed as guidance becomes available.

The Society's guidelines on the [management of cryptococcal meningitis](#) are currently being updated by a small team of experts. We anticipate publication in the June *Southern African Journal of HIV Medicine* and will share the draft for member

The Society is working with Medicines Sans Frontiers, the Rural Health Advocacy Project, Section 27 and the Treatment Action Campaign on a national drug monitoring and reporting initiative and will keep you informed as the project is developed.
