Message from the President

At the Vienna AIDS conference there was a renewed focus on the issue of 'donor fatigue' and decreased funding in a recessionary environment, despite the fact that we have many people who still need HIV care. There was justifiable anger at broken promises by certain political leaders, as well as a call for the world to acknowledge that AIDS remains a huge problem, particularly in sub-Saharan Africa.

In his plenary Bill Clinton made a good point: we need to do better with the money we have. We could work smarter, faster and more effectively with the human resources that exist in our health system. We could use our current antiretrovirals and TB drugs better, decreasing the need for migration to expensive regimens for resistant organism. We can look at where wastage and duplication occur, and stop it.

We cannot let donors or governments off the hook. But in a recessionary environment, the Society has had to take a hard look at how we ensure our own sustainability. Whilst we have a large membership, very few members pay their annual subscription fees. The Society continues to be donor funded, but these funds have decreased and donors are asking organizations to diversify their funding streams. **Hence as of 01st January 2011, only members who are up to date in their subscription fees will receive CPD certificates for Society branch meetings.** The Society branch meetings are still open to both members and non members, and for the time being all members will continue to receive the *Southern African Journal of HIV Medicine*.

In an attempt to reduce wastage please also ensure that your contact details are up to date so we can cut down on returned postage due to incorrect postal addresses.
