## Sponsored article by Adcock Ingram

## Legal Update: Post-Exposure Prophylaxis for Rape Survivors

The *HIV & AIDS and STI National Strategic Plan 2007 – 2011* (NSP) emphasises the need for access to post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) as part of a comprehensive package of services for rape survivors. In January 2005 the Department of Health released its *National Sexual Assault<sup>1</sup> Policy* and *National Management Guidelines for Sexual Assault Care*. One of the objectives of this policy was “to establish designated, specialized, accessible, 24 hour health care services for the holistic management of patients to improve health status after sexual assault.”<sup>2</sup>

The *National Sexual Assault Policy* sets out the relationship between health services and the SAPS. In line with the Policy, the *National 5 year Implementation Plan for the Service Charter for Victims of Crime 2007-2011* commits the South African Police Service to ensure that rape kits are properly managed and victims are transported to doctors and hospitals and back home. At some police stations, victim empowerment programmes are in place where volunteers assist rape survivors and take them to hospital. Many civil society organisations report that some police officers and health care professionals continue to treat rape survivors badly and fail to offer them the required support and services specified in the Policy.

The *Criminal Law (Sexual Offences) Amendment Act 32 of 2007* also entitles rape survivors to PEP at designated facilities. This chapter came into effect on 25 March 2008. The new Act (referred to as the Sexual Offences Act) now places a responsibility on a police official to whom a rape has been reported to inform a victim of the importance of obtaining PEP within 72 hours, the need to obtain medical advice regarding the possibility of other sexually transmitted infections and to provide him or her with a list of accessible public health establishments designated to provide free PEP (section 28). A victim is entitled to PEP from a public health facility if she lays a criminal charge with the police OR she reports the rape at a designated health facility. If a victim goes directly to a designated health facility and says that she has been raped, she does not have to prove that she was raped nor does she have to open a criminal case before she can access PEP. The Department of Health has not yet officially designated health facilities in terms of the Act.

The Sexual Offences Act's Regulations were published in the Government Gazette on 22 May 2008. In terms of the Regulations, “a medical practitioner or nurse to whom a sexual offence, where the victim may have been exposed to the risk of being infected with HIV as a result of that offence, is reported by a victim must complete the J88 form.” A medical practitioner or nurse to whom a rape is reported must also inform a victim where and how to obtain PEP and of her right to lay a criminal charge at the police station should she wish to do so.

The *Children's Act 38 of 2005* specifically states that consent to an HIV test may be given by a child if the child is 12 years or older or if the child is under the age of 12 but of sufficient maturity to understand the benefits, risks and social implications of such a test. The Act requires pre- and post test counselling by an appropriately trained person and entitles the child to confidentiality of his or her HIV results. The Act also specifically states

### NSP objectives on PEP

#### **Objective 2.9:**

<sup>1</sup> Reference to the term “sexual assault” in the NSP and Department of Health documents refer to all sexual offences including rape, whilst the term “sexual assault” in the *Criminal Law (Sexual Offences) Amendment Act* replaces and goes beyond the previous definition of indecent assault, and is different from rape which now refers to various forms of sexual penetration.

<sup>2</sup> The *National Sexual Assault Policy* identifies the following strategies to achieve this objective: 1. Provision of health care immediately after sexual assault; 2. Sexual Assault examination kits should be available at facilities that provide sexual assault services; 3. Providing proper treatment of injuries; 4. Ensuring safety and avoiding re-victimisation; 5. Preventing unwanted pregnancy; 6. Providing post-exposure prophylaxis for HIV; 7. Preventing and treating sexually transmitted infections; 8. Preventing and treating psychological distress; 9. Providing access to psychological/psychiatric care; 10. Medical certificates for sick leave; 11. On discharging the patient ensure that proper follow-up arrangements are in place; 12. Ensuring the integrity of the evidence chain; 13. Clinical management guidelines for health care professionals; 14. Provision of information to the patient; 15. Documentation of evidence; 16. Reporting of forensic evidence; 17. Giving evidence in court; 18. Accreditation of Providers of the service; 19. Provisions of support services for health providers to prevent vicarious trauma; 20. Services have to be supervised, monitored and evaluated on a regular basis; 21. Provision of adequate 24 hour facilities.

that no person may refuse to provide contraceptives to a child who is 12 years of age. These sections have been in operation since 1 July 2007.

Despite the good protection which the Refugees Act and the Constitution provide for the rights of those fleeing persecution in their home countries, on a daily basis asylum seekers and refugees struggle to realise their rights and make use of state services. There is very limited legal assistance available for refugees and asylum seekers to enable to help them with such challenges. It is for this reason that ProBono.Org, a non-profit clearing house increasing access to justice via *pro bono* legal services, provides a weekly legal clinic where refugees and asylum seekers can access free legal advice and services.

The weekly legal clinic operates as follows:

- It is open from 09h00 am to noon every Thursday.
- The clinic is staffed by attorneys from reputable law firms.

- Clients must make appointments, or are seen on a 'first come first serve' basis.
- Attorneys assist clients in any of the following ways: advice, opinions, non-litigious interventions, mediation, and/or litigation.
- As far as possible, attorneys attempt to resolve the problems immediately. Where this is not possible, the client becomes a client of the relevant firm, and the firm will finalise the matter on a *pro bono* basis.

### **PROBONO.ORG WILLS SESSIONS**

There is a day when all of us will die. It is a fact that we cannot avoid. Yet, for most of us it is hard to think about and hard to talk to other people about. Sometimes making plans for what is to happen after one's death, can feel like one is giving up on life. Yet, when we are ill or very old, concerns about will happen after our death, can lead to stress and worries. It can thus be very helpful to get advice on one's rights and the issues related to death and dying.

ProBono.Org, a non-profit clearing house increasing access to justice via pro bono legal services, are running Wills Sessions with the assistance of top law firms. These firms provide their professional advice and services for free. The Wills Sessions are for HIV+ people or old-aged pensioners who are indigent. The Wills Sessions are run at community-based organisations providing services to HIV+ people or old-aged pensioners.

The Wills Sessions focus on wills. It explains that a will is a document in which you can say who must look after your minor children after your death, and what must happen to your property (house, furniture, money, etc) after you die.
